The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on March 21, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Mayor John Roberts, Vice Mayor Eddie Pierce, Commissioners Ed LeCompte, Terry Pope and Carol Rose. Also present were City Manager Randall Smith, Police Chief Tim Christol, Fire Chief Mark Mathews, Public Works Director Tim Thornbury, Finance Director John Alexander, City Recorder Ruth Rohen and those listed on Exhibit A.

1. Resolution on the agenda tonight proclaiming April 1, 2017 "Autism Awareness Day" in the City.
2. Public Hearing and first reading on the agenda tonight to rezone property located at 4704 Dayton Blvd. from C-1 Commercial to L-1 Light Manufacturing, subject to conditions.
3. First reading on an ordinance to regulate the sale of beer relating to outdoor dining areas at restaurants holding a restaurant beer license and licensees holding a craft brewers sampling license, is on the agenda tonight.
4. First reading on an ordinance to amend the Mobile Food Truck ordinance to better define and standardize hours of operation and to allow Mobile Food Trucks only along Dayton Boulevard within the C-1 zone.
5. Resolution on the agenda tonight to approve a 6 month extension of the moratorium on the issuance of new permanent sign permits in the C-2 Central Business District and the issuance of new sign permits for billboard signs citywide.
6. Resolution on the agenda tonight in support of Southeast Tennessee Development District applying for grant funding through the Lyndhurst Foundation and the Benwood Foundation for a feasibility study in regard to the North Shore to North Chick Trails with Rails system.
7. Commissioner Rose advised that she would like the city to solicit historical photos of Red Bank to display at the Community Center.
8. Commissioner LeCompte asked Chief Christol to give an update in regard to possibly reinstating the K-9 Program. Chief Christol provided handouts to the Commission and advised that the donor is still interested in donating two K-9 Units and funding to cover the cost of training.
