COMMISSIONERS AGENDA WORK SESSION

5:00 p.m.

The City Commission of the City of Red Bank, Tennessee met in a public and duly advertised Agenda Work Session on March 1, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. at the Commission Chambers located at 3117 Dayton Boulevard. The date, time and location of the meeting was advertised in the Chattanooga Times Free Press, on the City's Facebook page and on the City of Red Bank website together with instructions and an internet link to enable virtual attendance by the public. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on and discuss upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Mayor Hollie Berry, Vice Mayor Stefanie Dalton, Commissioner Ruth Jenó, Commissioner Ed LeCompte and Commissioner Pete Phillips. Also present were City Manager Martin Granum, Fire Chief Brent Sylar, Police Chief Dan Seymour, Public Works Director Greg Tate, Finance Director John Alexander and City Recorder Tracey Perry and City Attorney Arnold Stulce.

- I. Unclaimed property disposal Res No. 22-1463

- II. Install of playground equipment by Hammerdown Outdoor Creations in the amount of \$12,746.00 Res No. 22-1464
Public Works Director Tate explained the intent of the Resolution, i.e. to authorize a contract to install the playground equipment at the Red Bank Community Center. No discussion.
- III. Budget Amendment – loan and premium pay – in the amount of \$153,603.00 Ord No. 22-1205
Finance Director Alexander explained the intent of the Ordinance, i.e. to amend the FY 2022 Operating Budget. Some discussion.
- IV. Red Bank Soddy Daisy Foundation Grant acceptance in the amount of \$23,000.00 Ord No. 22-1206
Fire Chief Sylar explained the intent of the Ordinance, i.e. to authorize the acceptance of the grant funding in order to fund the purchase of two (2) mobile signs. Some discussion.
- V. ARP discussion continued
City Manager Granum, Finance Director Alexander and Public Works Director Tate explained that they have been planning and discussing allocation concepts for the ARP funds that the City has and/or will receive for about six (6) months now. A revised concept plan was presented to the Commission, attached as Exhibit B. Much discussion ensued, no consensus was reached and the topic will be discussed again at the next regularly scheduled Work Session.

This item was addressed earlier in the meeting. Public Works Director Tate gave an update on some recent occurrences. Issuance of Building Permits is up to 20-30 per week, with 90-95% being residential permits. Some Codes Enforcement issues on Dayton Boulevard and McCahill Road involving old, disabled or dismantled vehicles will be addressed on April 7, 2022 at an Administrative Hearing.
