The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on October 20, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. The date, time and location of the meeting was advertised in the Hamilton County Herald and on the City of Red Bank web-site. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Acting Mayor Ruth Jenó, Commissioner Tyler Howell and Commissioner Ed LeCompte. Commissioner Carol Rose was absent. Also present were City Manager Tim Thornbury, City Attorney Arnold Stulce Jr. Finance Director John Alexander and those listed on Exhibit A.

1. City Manager Thornbury advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to apply for a property conservation grant through the city's insurance carrier. This is a 50/50 grant up to \$5,000 and if awarded will be used for security cameras at Fire Station 1.
2. City Manager Thornbury advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight authorizing a Certificate of Compliance for UMA Partnership at 3603 Dayton Blvd. He advised that this is a bi-annual process that is required by the State for the business to renew their liquor license. He advised that all ordinances and regulations pertaining to the license and to the issuance of the certificate of compliance have been checked, with no violations noted.
3. City Manager Thornbury advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to cancel the November 3rd Work Agenda and Commission meeting. He explained that this is Election Day and there are three Red Bank commission seats up for election this year. He explained that beginning December 1st the Agenda Work Session will start at 5:30 instead of 5:00.
4. City Manager Thornbury advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to approve repairs to the bridge on Valley View Ave. on an emergency basis. He advised that the bridge has been closed to traffic, due to the structural integrity of the bridge, following the advice of the city's contracted structural engineering firm. Upon inquiry by Commissioner, Howell City Manager Thornbury advised that the bridge will not be widened.
5. The Christmas Parade and Festival was discussed. Due to the on-going COVID 19 pandemic and rising numbers of new cases in Hamilton County, this year's parade and festival will not take place.
6. City Manager Thornbury gave an update on other and various projects ongoing in the city.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:16 p.m.
