The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on September 5, 2017 at 12:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Mayor John Roberts, Vice Mayor Eddie Pierce, Commissioners Ed LeCompte, Terry Pope and Carol Rose. Also present were City Manager Randall Smith, Fire Chief Mark Mathews, Police Chief Robert Simpson, Police Sergeant John Wright, Public Works Director Tim Thornbury, Finance Director John Alexander, and City Recorder Ruth Rohen.

1. City Manager Smith advised that there is a Public Hearing and 1st reading on an ordinance, based on an application by the property owner, to rezone property located at 311 E. Midvale Ave. from R-1 to R-T/Z Townhome Zero Lot Line on the agenda tonight.
2. City Manager Smith advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight authorizing the City to apply for the TML Safety Partners Driver Safety Grant. He explained that this is a 50/50 grant for up to \$2,500 and that the funds will be used to partially pay for GPS monitoring of city owned vehicles.
3. City Manager Smith explained that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to approve the purchase of a 2017 Ford Explorer for the police department. The purchase would be based on the State of Tennessee contract from Murfreesboro Ford.
4. City Manager Smith advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to extend the agreement between the City and Trust for Public Land. He advised that this is in regard to extending the Stringer's Ridge walking trails to White Oak Park.
5. Sergeant John Wright presented information in regard to purchasing new Tasers for the police department. He explained that their current Tasers are 10 years old and are at the end of life expectancy, with several that are non-operational. This would be a single source of supply contract. He presented three options for purchasing the Tasers but recommended a five year purchase plan that includes purchasing 20 Tasers and Holsters, batteries and 2 cartridges per Taser. He explained that this plan also includes unlimited training cartridges and replacement of regular cartridges and batteries. The cost for the purchase contract would be \$5,440.00 the first year and \$7,440.00 for the remaining four years, for a total of \$35,200.00. The Tasers would be purchased using the drug fund.
6. City Manager Smith gave an update on the K-9 Program.
7. Mayor Roberts advised that the organizers of the Red Bank Farmer's Market would like to use the Red Bank Park on Mondays to host the farmer's market.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:45 p.m.
