The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on August 2, 2016 at 12:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Vice Mayor Eddie Pierce and Commissioners Rick Causer, Terry Pope and Ed LeCompte. Mayor Roberts was absent. Also present were City Manager Randall Smith, Police Chief Tim Christol, Fire Chief Mark Mathews, Finance Director John Alexander, and City Recorder Ruth Rohen. There were no citizen attendees.

1. Vice Mayor Pierce advised that second and final reading on an ordinance to rezone property located at 1103 Coker Cir. and second and final reading on an ordinance to amend parking regulations for businesses is on the agenda tonight.
2. City Manager Smith advised that first reading on an ordinance to amend the budget for roll over grant funds for the three transportation projects is on the agenda tonight.
3. City Manager Smith advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to approve the purchase of fifteen body armor vest and protective panels for the police department. Chief Christol explained the items that would be purchased. Chief Christol also asked the Commission to consider amending the FY 2017 budget in the amount of \$25,000 for the purchase of rapid response body armor in addition to the standard body armor referred to in the resolution that is on tonight's agenda.
4. City Manager Smith advised that the fencing at the Dog Park has been replaced and mulch will be going down soon.
5. City Manager Smith advised that replacement of the White Oak Park restrooms destroyed by fire is almost complete and should reopen next week.
6. City Manager Smith advised that the Kenneth Buchanan dedication plaque will be installed at the swimming pool today.
7. City Manager Smith advised that the Christmas tree that was planted last year at Kids Corner Park has died. He noted that this is one of several live Christmas trees planted there that has died.
8. City Manager Smith advised that Mayor Roberts asked him to inquire about the old middle school property and what steps the Commission felt would be appropriate to start the redevelopment process. It was determined that the City will solicit RFP's for development of the property.
9. Commissioner Pope advised he has received a request that the City extend or readjust the hours of operation for the Recycle Center so that it is open later on Tuesday and Thursday during summer hours.
10. Commissioner Pope advised that he has received calls in regard to a home being constructed on Ashmore Ave. that area residents believe will have rooms for rent.
11. City Manager Smith inquired if the Commission would be interested in attending the Chattanooga Chamber of Commerce Annual Meeting where Governor Haslam will be speaking.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:40 p.m.
