The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on July 21, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Vice Mayor Eddie Pierce, Commissioners Rick Causer, Ed LeCompte and Terry Pope, Mayor John Roberts was absent. Also present were City Manager Randall Smith, Police Chief Tim Christol, Fire Chief Mark Mathews, Public Works Director Tim Thornbury, Finance Director John Alexander and City Recorder Ruth Rohen.

1. City Manager Smith advised that the first reading adopting new personnel policies for the city is on the agenda tonight. There was some discussion to clarify the policy in regard to tuition reimbursement, compensatory time and vacation accrual.
2. City Manager Smith explained the Memorandum of Understanding for quick clearance of roadways in Tennessee following an accident or incident. There is a resolution on the agenda tonight requesting approval of the Memorandum of Understanding
3. City Manager Smith explained the Memorandum of Understanding for police transports of "Certificate of Need" patients. He advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight requesting approval of the Memorandum of Understanding.
4. City Manager Smith explained that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to place a moratorium on the issuance of permits to construct new multi-family housing units within the City. He advised that the moratorium is for a period of 180 days.
5. City Manager Smith advised that there are three resolutions on the agenda tonight seeking approval to enter into an agreement with Wiser Consultants, LLC for engineering services in regard to three transportation improvement projects that consist of paving Dayton Boulevard between Greenleaf Street and Browntown Road, signalization upgrades at five intersections in Red Bank, and pedestrian / traffic calming islands on Dayton Blvd.
6. City Manager Smith advised that Joe Ward has complied with instructions provided to him for removing the large dirt and debris mound that was located on his property in the 2000 block of Dayton Blvd.
7. City Manager Smith explained that Hamilton County Mayor Jim Coppinger recently met with area mayors and is proposing that Hamilton County receive a portion of municipal State Shared Taxes. The proposed amount that Red Bank would be losing in revenue is \$273,450 per year and could fluctuate depending on population.
8. City Manager Smith explained that he was approached by a citizen and asked why he didn't respond with the police and fire department during inclement weather events. He advised the commission members that there are two reasons: 1) He has full confidence that emergency responders are well trained to handle the events, and 2) He does not respond because he may get in the way of these several emergency responders.
