The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on June 16, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Mayor John Roberts, Vice Mayor Eddie Pierce and Commissioners Rick Causer, Ed LeCompte and Terry Pope. Also present were City Manager Randall Smith, Police Chief Tim Christol, Fire Chief Mark Mathews, Public Works Director Tim Thornbury, Finance Director John Alexander, and City Recorder Ruth Rohen

1. Second reading and Public Hearing for the 2015 – 2016 Operating Budget is on tonight's Commission Agenda. Mayor Roberts requested that an additional \$15,000 be added to the budget to assist with economic development.
2. Second and final reading on the 2015 – 2016 Revenue Ordinance is on tonight's Commission Agenda.
3. Second and final reading to amend the FY 2015 budget in regard to fiscal year 2015 appropriation overages is on the agenda tonight.
4. City Manager Smith explained that there is a Beer Board Meeting tonight. He explained that The Taraloka Foundation has requested a Special Event Permit to conduct a benefit concert on June 20th at The Meeting House. Mr. Smith explained and Chief Christol reiterated that the City's current beer ordinance will not allow this because The Meeting House is located too close to a daycare and that The Meeting House is listed as the Red Bank Chapel of The Mission church. Mayor Roberts requested that the current beer ordinance be emailed to the Commissioners.
5. Mayor Roberts advised that there is a resolution on the agenda tonight to approve an agreement with Lane Funeral Home to use the Kids Korner Park for a summer gospel music concert series.
6. Mayor Roberts suggested that the Commissioners plan a fact finding trip to Atlanta to tour a development located there.
7. Commissioner LeCompte advised that the Lions Club asked if the City would like to partner with them in celebrating the Lion's Club 75th anniversary year and the City's 60th anniversary year and Red Bank High School's anniversary celebration in August.
