The Board of Commissioners met in a public and advertised Agenda Work Session on May 19, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to receive information on upcoming business items. Those in attendance were Mayor John Roberts, Vice Mayor Eddie Pierce and Commissioners Rick Causer, Ed LeCompte and Terry Pope. Also present were City Manager Randall Smith, Police Chief Tim Christol, Fire Chief Mark Mathews, Public Works Director Tim Thornbury, Finance Director John Alexander, and City Recorder Ruth Rohen

1. Public Hearing and second and final reading concerning abandoning an unopened right of way on Berkley Drive is on the Commission agenda tonight.
2. Public Hearing and second and final reading amending the Zoning Ordinance in regard to set back and distance regulations in Planned Unit Developments is on the Commission agenda tonight.
3. First reading for an ordinance regulating Alternative Financial Institutions is on the Commission Agenda tonight.
4. First reading to approve paying employees for accrued vacation hours over 400 hours is on the Commission agenda tonight.
5. First reading to amend the FY 2015 budget to include funding to pay employees for accrued vacation time over 400 hours is on the Commission agenda tonight.
6. City Manager Smith explained that there is a resolution to approve a contract for blood draw services on the agenda tonight. He advised that the blood draws are conducted on certain DUI arrest and some of the cost of the blood draw can be recuperated through assessed court fines.
7. City Manager Smith provided the Commission with a proposed ordinance regulating Mobile Food Trucks. There was some discussion in reference to special permitting for special events. This item will be on the June 2nd Commission agenda for first reading.
8. Mayor Roberts encouraged everyone to attend the rededication ceremony for Erlanger North Hospital on June 14th.
9. Commissioner Causer provided a document detailing his concerns in regard to the construction of Pedestrian Islands on Dayton Blvd. City Manager Smith gave an overview and parameters of the project.
10. Commissioner Causer had some concerns about potential issues arising from extending Stringer's Ridge Trail.
11. Commissioner LeCompte inquired as to whether upgrades to Browntown Road would be required due to the new housing development on Browntown Road in the City of Chattanooga.
